

Seek Information From the Right Source



Before devoting myself to my law firm, I taught business law for about ten years. Students still contact me regularly to ask me for methodological advice.

One of the major tips I give them is to make it a habit of looking for information from the right source.

At university, as in business schools, students are systematically encouraged to read books and articles published by teachers. However, a lawyer's absolute priority should be first to **read the normative texts** (and, in particular, the law) themselves.

A lawyer must not place somebody's head between his own head and the legal norms. He must forge **his own vision** of the regulations.

He will thus be able to apply the legal standards appropriately and allow himself the possibility of making them evolve, as well as acting as a creator in an optimized way, given the needs of his clients.
